Mr. Kaets has had more than 30 years experience composing for and accompanying silent films throughout Europe, Asia and Russia and was professor for film music at the Heinrich-Heine-University in Düsseldorf for 10 years.

He has worked intensively with many of the German and English film pianists and organists remaining from the times of silent films so that his screenings are distinguished by historically accurate performance practice.

He is one of the most experienced musicians in germany and the first one starting here regurlary silent-movie-concerts in churches after the end of the silent movie Era.

Beginning in 1986, Kaets has been intensely involved with composing music for silent film. To date over 290 compositions to his credit and over 400 concerts. Artistic advisor for the original historic Welte-Theatre Organ residing in the Museum for Cinema in Düsseldorf; has kept contact to original artists who played organ in movie theatres during the silent film Era.

He has been the first composer/artist since the end of the silent film era to perform regurlarly historic movies within churches with live-music and started the renaissance of this kind of silent-movie-concerts in germany and middle-europe.

Kaets own compositions have been heard world-wide in **concert halls** (including Cologne (Kölner) Philharmonic, Royal Opera House Muscat / Oman, Oetkerhalle Bielerfeld, Concerthall Wien, Theatre de Cappucines Luxenbourg, Concert Hall Perm /Russia and many others...),

Kaets has participated in various silent film festivals; he played at great retrospectives on famous silent movie directors like Fritz Lang, Fr.W. Murnau, Wsewolod Pudowkin, Erich von Strohheim, Carl Th. Dreyer, Charles Chaplin, Buster Keaton, Lew Kuleschow, Sergej Eisenstein...

He has given seminars on silent movie accompaniment in many great European states (Dresden, Essen, Hagen, Leipzig, Düsseldorf, Frankfurt, Linz, Rheinfelden) and enjoyed a professorship in media arts from 1992 until 2001 at the Heinrich-Heine University in Düsseldorf.
